#### Our school goals - 2018

Our role as educators at Mother Teresa Primary is to provide quality Catholic schooling for every student. The core 'business' of school is teaching and learning. We are very determined at Mother Teresa Primary School to keep our focus on teaching and learning. As previously introduced in Heartlinks, we are focussing in on 3 'big' goals for 2018 in Religious Education, literacy and numeracy. Mrs Boyd explored our Religious Education goal in our previous edition of 90 seconds with the Principal. Today we explore our literacy goal and how parents can help us to achieve this goal focussing on the quality of student writing. In future editions we will explore our numeracy goal based on multiplicative thinking. Our three main goals for 2018, based on previous whole school data are:

- Religious Education: All students will interpret and apply Sacred Scripture to their lives through the process of critical thinking.
- <u>Numeracy</u>: All students will use multiplicative thinking when solving problems in multiplication and division.
- <u>Literacy:</u> All students will improve the quality of their writing for a wide range of purposes and audiences.

#### Communication between school & home

It has been great to already have many opportunities to welcome all families to the school this year with our 'cuppa with the Principal' chat, our welcome BBQ and information nights, our 'meet and greets' with the teachers and our open school following Mass last Wednesday.

In addition to these channels of communication, we regularly place important information and <u>updates about school and community events through:</u>

- **Skoolbag app**: this is one of our main forms of communication with families, with information and reminders, alerts, events and school newsletters. The Skoolbag app also has a section for 'Events' a link to our Mother Teresa School calendar.
- <u>Heartlinks:</u> our school newsletter contains important information about upcoming events and important information regarding teaching and learning at Mother Teresa Primary, plus our embedded 90 seconds with the Principal which outlines the ways home and school can support each other in achieving our learning goals.
- Website: the school website contains additional information regarding our policies and procedures, which are directly linked to CEDP (Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta) guidelines and policies, as well as the parent handbook.
- <u>Facebook</u>: this avenue of communication allows us to share celebrations of some of the learning at Mother Teresa Primary.

If necessary, parents are welcome to make appointments with the Assistant Principal or Principal. Areas of concern outside your child's learning or learning studio behaviour can be discussed with the Principal by making an appointment e.g. unresolved issues regarding learning studio, financial concerns, clarification of issues, discussion of educational policies or the whole school program.

This year at Mother Teresa Primary we continue to acknowledge those students who have demonstrated our learner qualities of compassion, creativity, passion, reflection and collaboration through the school recognition cards. There are usually at least two sent home each year. These cards are completed by each learning studio teacher and also by other staff members and signed by myself before being mailed home to the student, where they can celebrate this acknowledgement with family and friends.

The methodology of the program is safe, supportive, non-judgmental and designed to provide students with positive and useful tools they can use in their everyday lives. #### **Student Eating Time**

Students at Mother Teresa Primary currently have 10 minutes eating time at both recess and lunchtime. As Kindergarten are becoming accustomed to life at school they are given more than 10 minutes to continue eating before they move onto the playground to play. Children in every grade, Kindergarten to Year 6 will continue to be given the usual 10 minutes eating time but from Monday, if your child would like to take longer to eat before they move off to play they may take their lunchbox to a designated quiet area on the playground until they have finished eating. They will then place their lunchbox into their Year group basket and they can then collect their lunchbox on their way back to class lines at the end of recess or lunch.
