Next week the students in Years 3 and 5 at Mother Teresa Primary will participate in NAPLAN testing, as with every student across Australia. The **National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)** is a one off test of aspects of literacy and numeracy. It provides some evidence of your child's strengths and areas of challenge in literacy and numeracy. The teachers have prepared the students to participate in the procedures associated with these tests, without diverting attention away from quality teaching and learning. I thank the teachers for their professionalism and wish the students well.


