WORK, HEALTH & SAFETY - Mother Teresa Primary

New Red Zone Safety - Thank you so much to all our parents and carers collecting students in the afternoon at Kiss and Ride for your cooperation with our safe collection of students. We have the teacher at microphone duty stationed in a high visibility vest at the beginning of the 'red zone' and ask all cars to wait until directed to move to the pick up zone. The reason behind this new safety measure is to ensure clear visibility for all drivers moving up towards the pedestrian crossing. Please do not stop your vehicle on the pedestrian crossing. We ask all parents who have collected children to remain vigilant around the crossing once they have collected their children.

<u>Thank you Constable Chris</u> - As you know, our Police Community Liaison Officer, Constable Chris, has recently visited our Stage 2 and 3 students to deliver talks on Cyber Safety. In Term 3, Constable Chris will be speaking to our Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 students about following road safety rules and will again be visiting our school to observe the afternoon collection procedures.

<u>Collection Procedures</u> - To ensure safety of both students and staff at Mother Teresa we ask you not to leave your vehicle in the afternoons when you come to collect your child from the pick up zone. A teacher on duty, wearing a high visibility vest will help your child to move into your vehicle, from the gutter side/<u>left hand side of the vehicle only</u>. Please DO NOT direct your child around to the other side of the vehicle for obvious safety reasons. We ask that school bags not be loaded into the back of the vehicle, by parents, staff or students, again for obvious safety concerns.

<u>Bus Lanes</u> - Please do not use the bus bay or the bus lanes to drop off your child in the mornings - please use our regular kiss and drop zone. The bus bay and bus lanes are for the exclusive use of the school buses which service Mother Teresa, Catherine McAuley and Parramatta Marist. Thank you for your cooperation.
