Home/school communication guidelines and Seesaw

It was great to meet with parents and introduce our Seesaw app which will come into use from next week. As you know there are regular forms of communication between home and school, notably the MTP Skoolbag app and the fortnightly Heartlinks school newsletter which contains a lot of information in regards to events coming up in the school. These two forms of communication will remain the main channels of communication regarding school events in 2019.

The Seesaw app has been introduced to MTP as a means for your child to develop a digital portfolio of their work across the year. It is not a means of communication about other issues that arise from day to day with your child's teacher, e.g. my child lost their hat. All of our teachers have families and as you would understand they will not be responding to late night messages.

If anything does need to be communicated you are very welcome to call the school and a message will be passed onto your child's teacher, who will return your call as soon as possible. If you wish to come up for an interview with your child's teacher you are very welcome to do so by calling the school office and arranging a mutually convenient time to meet. **Teachers will not be responding to questions and messages through Seesaw.** You are very welcome to contact the school via email listed below if you wish to make an appointment or speak with a teacher.


WHS - Safety for all at Mother Teresa Primary


