School Times and Procedures

There is no supervision before 8.05am so we request that other arrangements be made if you need to drop your child at school before this time. Hot Weather

As we are all well aware we are in a long hot summer that will hopefully come to an end very soon. As notified previously on our Skoolbag app, on extremely hot days our students remain inside during lunch time as our Learning Studios are air-conditioned. We also have the option for students to bring their lunches/water bottles inside on these days.

School Uniform

It has been great to see all of our boys and girls return to school in 2019 wearing their school uniform with pride. Now that the holidays have ended and we return to normal school routines, we ask for your support in adhering to our school uniform dress code.

A few extra reminders include:

- All socks need to sit above the ankle bone
- Boys white shirts need to be tucked in
- Girls can wear ribbons that are the school colours in their hair for example, on sports days red, navy and white are acceptable and on full school uniform days white, navy and the same colour blue as the girls summer uniform are acceptable.
- Girls need to have their hair tied back every day and please no extreme haircuts for our boys

If you have any questions regarding our school uniform please contact the school. Please remember to label uniforms with your child's name, especially their hat and if you are interested in getting the school sunglasses for your child these are available for purchase at the school office.

Finally, there have been some queries around what colours socks students need to wear on sports days. All girls wear white sports socks that sit above the ankle bone and from 2019 all boys can also wear white sports socks (though navy socks are still acceptable) these must sit above the ankle bone.

WHS - Safety for all at Mother Teresa Primary

- As we all know, Mother Teresa Primary is a part of the <u>Westmead Catholic Community</u> and as such we use shared facilities. The <u>visitor car park</u> is open to all in the community if you wish to park your car and walk in for the morning drop off or the afternoon pick up. A small proportion of the staff car park is for the Mother Teresa staff, the majority belongs to the Catherine McAuley and Parramatta Marist schools. **PLEASE** do not drive in their facilities. On occasions, such as parent information evenings, the Principals of both High Schools allow us to open the boom gate and let parents park in any free spaces - if you see that the boom gate is open you are welcome to park in the staff car park, otherwise please do not park there. Our Police Liaison Officer, Constable Chris and other Police are often visiting the school and are aware the community is clear about these expectations.
- The Red Zone thanks to the vast majority of parents/carers who have been really helpful in not stopping on the red zone, just in front of the pedestrian crossing approaching the Kiss and Drop area. This is for safety as young children crossing the road can be clearly seen on both driving lanes. We ask that you follow the speed limit and are aware there are many pedestrians using this shared space, including toddlers and younger siblings of our Mother Teresa students.


