MTP Heartlinks Highlights Video - A celebration of Mums

Last Friday we were lucky enough to gather together as a community to celebrate the gift of Motherhood and thank all the wonderful Mums and mother figures in our lives. In our Catholic Church, May is a special month of honour to Mary, the Mother of God. In our Heartlinks Highlights video we hear thoughts and reflections on our Mums, from some of our MTP students.

Writing and assessment at MTP

All parents would be aware of the heightened media coverage of learning this week during the 2021 NAPLAN testing period. As parents know from our Parent Universities held each term, our focus on teaching, learning and assessing never ceases - we call our most effective assessment formative assessment - we know from research and practice this ongoing feedback loop has the greatest impact on student learning. The NAPLAN assessments simply give a snapshot of learning on one day which supports the data we continue to collect throughout the year.

An example of this ongoing assessment each term at MTP occurs when students from Kindergarten to Year 6 participate in a "cold write" activity early every term. All students from K-6 get to 'see' or 'participate' in the same stimulus material, e.g. a picture, a sound, a scene outside. From there, students produce a piece of writing (or text) of their choice. These writing samples are moderated across each grade, where teachers grade the writing against the <u>National Literacy Progressions</u> for 'Creating Texts' (CrT) from Level 1 (sample indicator: draws pictures and shapes) to Level 11 (sample indicator: in imaginative writing uses recurring imagery for cohesion). This data about your child's performance in the cold write is used to track growth within and across years. The cold write for this term was a mystery scene set up outside, where the children got to spend some time observing and taking notes in their own 'Writer's Notebooks'. The children then converted these notes into their own stories. Check out the scene below which was used for our Term 2 'cold write' experience across the school.

Term 2 Parent Forum - 'Cuppa with the Principal'

Each term we have an informal parent forum with myself and Mrs. Katherine Stennett (Assistant Principal) at MTP. Last year during COVID we tried online zoom forums which were successful and last term we conducted another successful online parent forum zoom. This term we are hoping to return to our *face-to-face "Cuppa with the Principal"* parent forum - please note if there are changes in relation to COVID restrictions and schools, we will still go ahead with the forum but run it as an online zoom event. All parents are warmly invited to attend - this is a great opportunity to meet other MTP parents, discuss initiatives regarding the learning at school and ask questions regarding the school.

Term 2 Parent University - Mathematics

We are hoping to run an 'in person' Parent University this term, as we did last term. As Parent University is an indoor gathering in one place, parents will need to be registered to attend to ensure we can follow the COVID safety plan and current restrictions on physical distancing. Term 2 'Celebration of Learning'

The 'Celebration of Learning', where parents are invited to see their child's Learning Studio and are led on a tour of the studio by their child, will also have to be <u>timed and registered</u>, as with all grades and Learning Studio spaces, the COVID restrictions about physical distancing will need to be maintained. At this stage we plan on holding three time slots for the Celebration of Learning on Wednesday 16th June at 4.30pm, 5.00pm or 5.30pm. The Parent University for Term 2 will focus on Mathematics and will be at 6.00pm, also on Wednesday 16th June, for those parents interested.

Mother Teresa Primary Cross Country Team


