#### MTP Heartlinks Highlights Video - Maths Games at Home

Coming up later this term (Wednesday 16th June 6pm) our Term 2 Parent University is focussed on supporting your child with Mathematics. In preparation for this event Mr Wallis and our teachers would like to provide some examples of quick and easy 'Maths Games' you could play with your child at home to assist in developing a deep and flexible understanding of how numbers work. Thanks to the MTP students who volunteered to help us out by demonstrating the games in our Heartlinks Highlights video this week.

#### Parent Forum - Cuppa with the Principal

It was great to meet up with some of our parents face-to-face yesterday to discuss our learning focus and reflect on community issues. We discussed current and future events planned for our school. We got an opportunity to introduce Mrs Sharon Duff. our consultant Occupational therapist and discussed a little about her role in the school. We went over our school goals in both Religious Education and our learning focus. We discussed the attempt to re-introduce Parent Reading Helpers with a refresher course on Tuesday 22nd June at 8.40am for any parents who would like to volunteer to assist with reading support at school - as with all future events we will need to follow NSW Government and CEDP guidelines about COVID safety at the time. We discussed our plans to offer Parent/Teacher interviews for the half-yearly as either face-to-face or zoom options - more details about booking in will be shared with the community shortly. We are planning on running our Colour Challenge Fun Day in Term 3 on the McAuley Ovals (dates to be shared when confirmed) and this will be another opportunity where we will require parent helpers to assist in running the activities on the day. Some concerns and questions were raised about the quality of school uniforms and this will be discussed with our supplier, Oz Fashions as soon as possible - once I have spoken to Oz Fashions I will communicate to parents the outcome of this meeting. Ideas moving forward include establishing a Parent Library where books focussed on learning, wellbeing and our approach to teaching and learning will be made available for parents to borrow from the school. We plan to hold our next Parent Forum - "Cuppa with the Principal" in Week 6 of Term 3, Friday 20th August at 8.40am in the staffroom.

#### TTFM (Tell Them From Me) - Monday 31st May to Friday 25th June

Every year, every school in the Diocese invites students, staff and parents to provide feedback to each school about their school community. The TTFM (Tell Them From Me) survey is voluntary but it would be greatly appreciated if as many parents as possible participate in this survey. The TTFM survey period is Monday 31st May to Friday 25th June. Students in Years 4, 5 and 6 participate in a student survey during school time during the survey period. Staff also participate in the survey and provide feedback on different aspects of our school. Parents are asked some questions which are rated on a scale and there is also an optional open ended response available for parents to provide feedback. Whilst the responses are anonymous, please note that the open text question in the surveys is read by principals only. Any detailed information in the open text could potentially identify the respondent so generic comments are recommended. There will be further reminders for parents through Skoolbag throughout the survey period. I thank you in advance for taking the time to complete this once a year survey.

This week all parents of students in Years 4, 5 and 6 have received an information letter regarding student participation in TTFM. If you <u>do not want</u> your Year 4, 5 and 6 child to participate, please return this form to school.
